There is also a small plaque which reads:

Since then many hours have been taken up in the design and print of the display banners, children's quiz, publicity leaflet and 20 page booklet. Some things were only received back in the last few days before our first open day but we got there. We didn't have a huge turnout but we know that word is getting around and we hope that more will come as the months progress and we have been mentioned on the weekly Erith blog (Arthur Pewty's Maggot Sandwich) and on the Bexley Local Studies Facebook page. We are hosting the district meeting in July when we hope that many of you will be able to come and see what we have done. (Open day photo courtesy of Hugh N )

Last year we suggested to the PCC that the ringers would clean up the gravel circle round the war memorial that had become more of a garden that a driveway with all the weeds and grass growing through. Clearing the weeds turned out to be a somewhat time consuming exercise and took many visits, often on a Sunday afternoon. Laying the new gravel turned out to be a surprisingly quick job with five volunteers, two wheelbarrows, two rakes and three shovels and was accomplished in less than an hour and a half.

We have also designed and fitted safety hoops to the ladder up to the clock face galleries. While the ladder has been flagged up as a concern there seems to be no worries about the safety levels once you reach the galleries where there are only lightweight railings and some rope to stop you falling 18 feet down to bell frame level! We have purchased some modern standard railings and are waiting for a chance to install them.

Some of you who have been around the district for many years may remember Emily Smith who rang at Christchurch from the early 1950s until the late 1990s and always rang the treble standing on a box. She died in early March at the age of 92 and the bells were rung open for her funeral.

A quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles was rung on March 29th in memory of Emily. It was also Matthew's first quarter rung to celebrate his 18th birthday and the Ruby wedding of Liz and Les.
